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What is the Children with Special Health Care Needs Program?

CSHCN is a federally and state-funded Title V Maternal–Child Health Bureau program offered through Snohomish Health District. It provides the following:

- Linkages and coordination of services for all children with special needs
- Limited direct medical services, equipment and supplies to those families that meet financial and other program eligibility requirements

Who is eligible for services?

- Children birth up to 18 years of age.
- Children who are at increased risk of serious chronic physical, developmental, behavioral or emotional conditions.
- Children who require health and related services of a type or amount beyond what is generally required.

Here are some examples of chronic or risk conditions:

Asthma, cancer, autism spectrum disorder, cerebral palsy, Down Syndrome, cleft lip and/or palate, cystic fibrosis, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, prematurity, speech/language delay, sickle cell anemia, diabetes, arthritis, blindness, hearing loss, gross and/or fine motor delay.

What services are offered?

Public Health Nurse Care Coordination telephone consultation services are offered to families in Snohomish County regardless of income to:

- Assess a child's needs
- Refer a child to services
- Work with agencies to help provide services for a child

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
