**What are Savvy Septic Rebates?** Snohomish County Health Department’s Savvy Septic Program provides up to \$500 in septic rebates to homeowners on residential properties throughout the county for septic maintenance work. ## How to Apply

### 1 Take Our Septic Care Workshop

### 2 Have the Septic Maintenance Work Done & Save Your Receipts

The septic professional you hire must be certified to perform the work they are doing. You can find a list of certified septic contractors at [Snohd.org](http://Snohd.org). Be sure to hold onto receipts so that you can submit your proof of payment!

### 3 Apply for Your Rebate!

### 4 Receive Your Rebate

Once your application is processed, a check will be sent to your mailing address. If you are ineligible for a rebate, we will reach out to let you know why.

## Available Rebates

Inspection Rebate	\$100
Pumping Rebate	\$100
Riser Install Rebate	\$50 per riser, up to 2 risers
Minor Repair Rebate	Up to \$200

\*Minor repairs include but are not limited to pump, baffle, or d-box replacement, system control repairs, filter installation or repair, and minor tank repairs.

## Eligibility

- Must have completed our free, online workshop
- Must be the owner of the property
- Property must be located in Snohomish County
- Work must be completed by a certified provider
- Work must have been done in the last 12 months
- Must submit proof of payment
