

# Weekly COVID-19 Graphs

January 1 – September 2, 2023

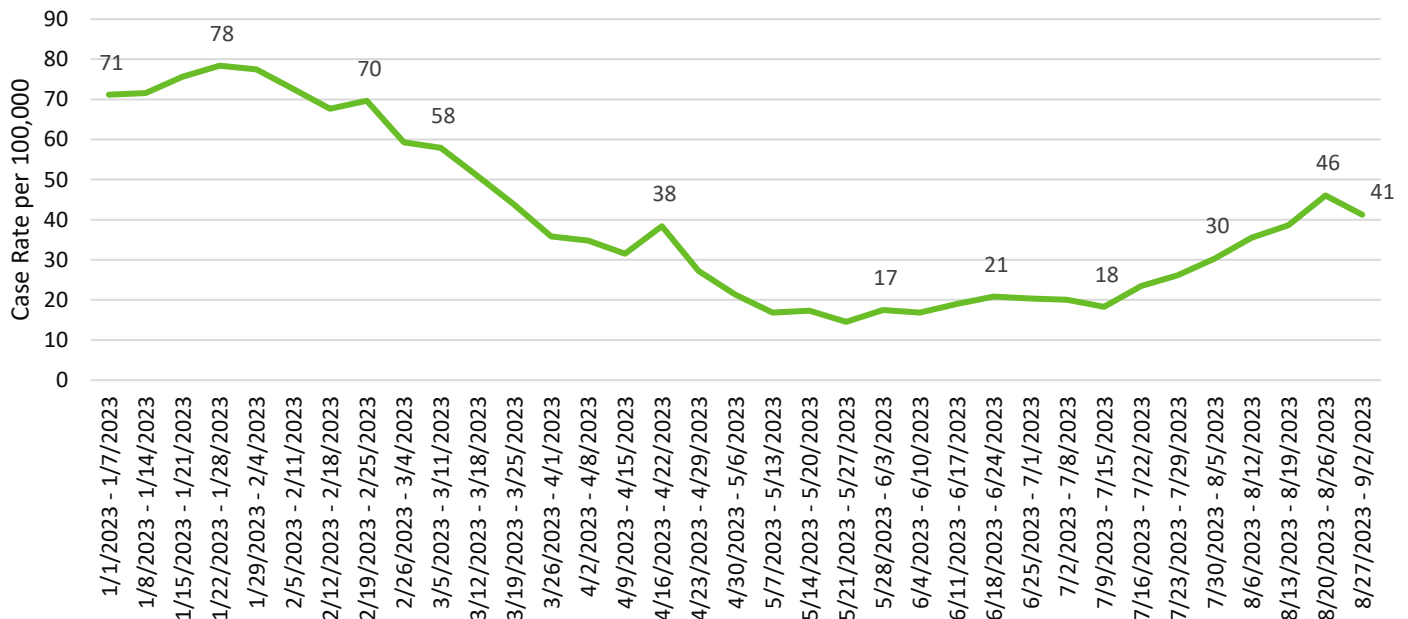
## CASE DATA:

The Washington State Disease Reporting System (WDRS) is the data source for all case data. Some data have been suppressed due to inaccuracies. Not all tables and graphs will have the same denominator. All trend data are by symptom onset date or date of first positive COVID test. All data are preliminary and subject to change.

## SNOHOMSH COUNTY SUMMARY:

- Snohomish County case rates increased over the past month with a slight decrease in the last week. (Only cases tested by a healthcare provider or laboratory are counted in this report. Homebased tests are not reported to public health and are not included in these data.)
- COVID-19-related hospitalizations increased over the last month with a peak case rate of 3.9/100,000 for the week of August 20-26.
- COVID-19 transmission was between 10-49/100,000 across most zip codes in Snohomish County. Case rates were highest in the northwest (Everett, Marysville, Lake Stevens) and rural southeast parts of the county. Note, change in the COVID-19 map case-rate ranges to align with the Washington State Department of Health.
- Case rates increased in all age groups during the month of August. Over the last week (8/27-9/2/2023) most age groups saw a decrease in cases except for the following age groups: 0-14, 20-29, 40-49. Highest case-rates are amongst our 70+ population, which is due to higher rates of testing, and small population size.
- Overall COVID-19 case rates were up during August for all race/ethnicity groups. Variability seen was amongst racial groups with small population sizes.
- There has been an increase in the number of cases associated with reported long-term care facility (LTCF) outbreaks during the month of August. There were over 100 cases associated with 16 facility outbreaks from July 30<sup>th</sup> through September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023.

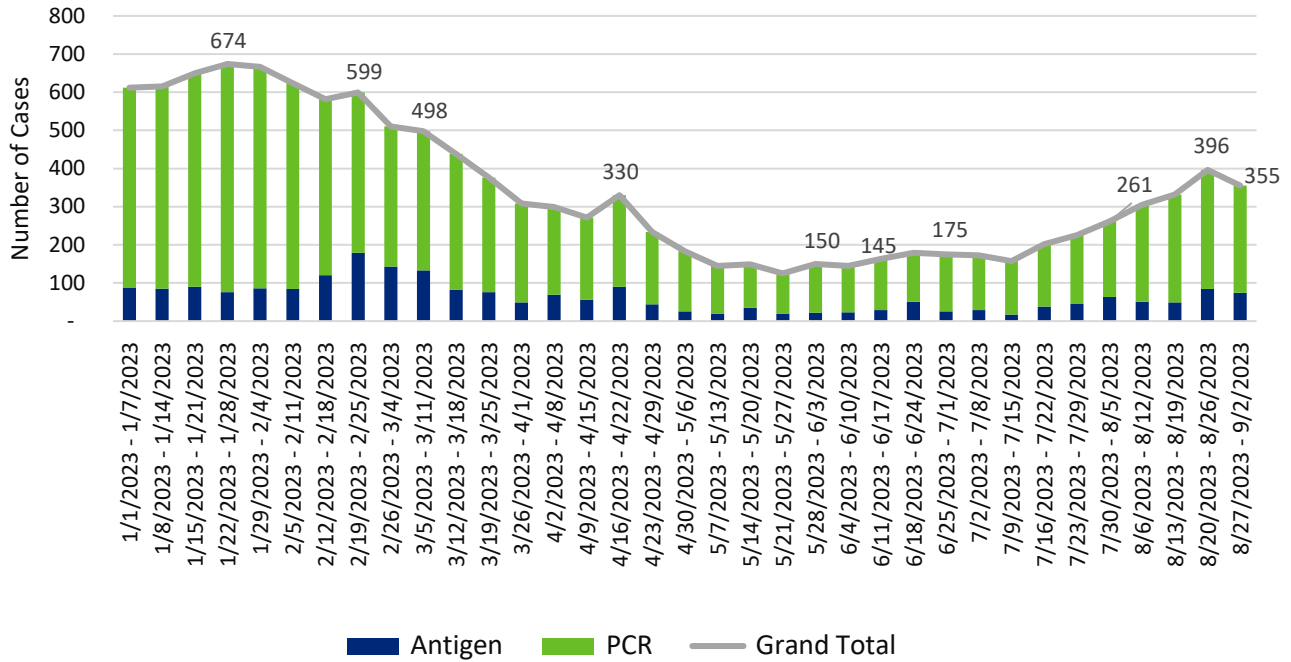
**Snohomish County COVID-19 Weekly Case Rates per 100,000 by Symptom Onset Date**



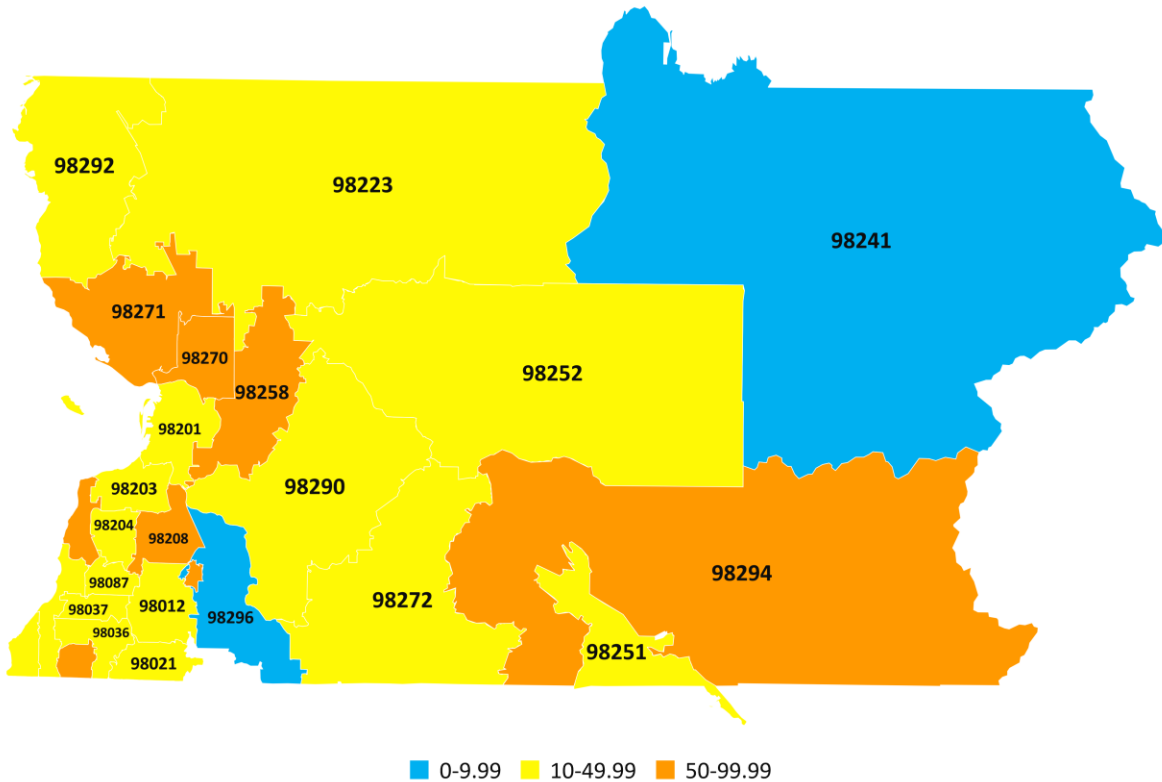
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## Snohomish County COVID-19 Cases by Onset Date



## Snohomish County COVID-19 Case Rates per 100,000 by Zip Code August 27 - September 2, 2023

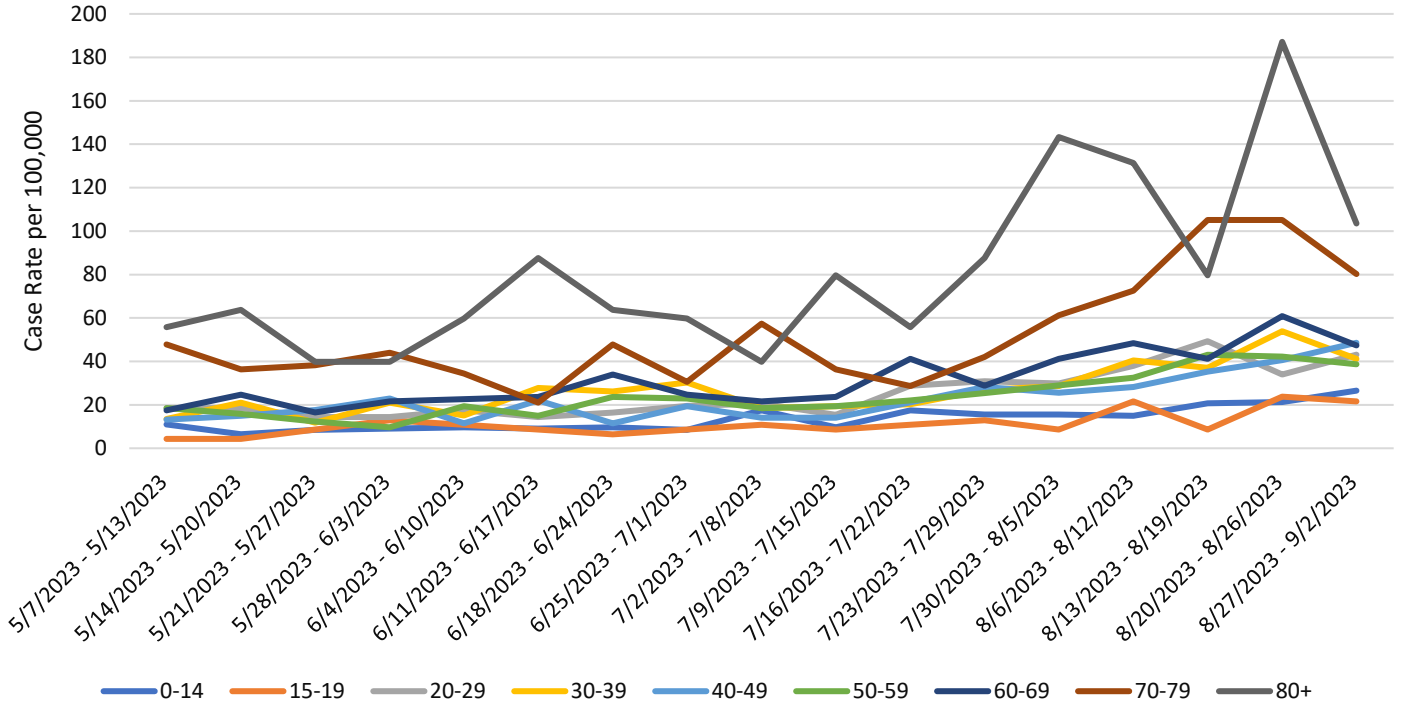


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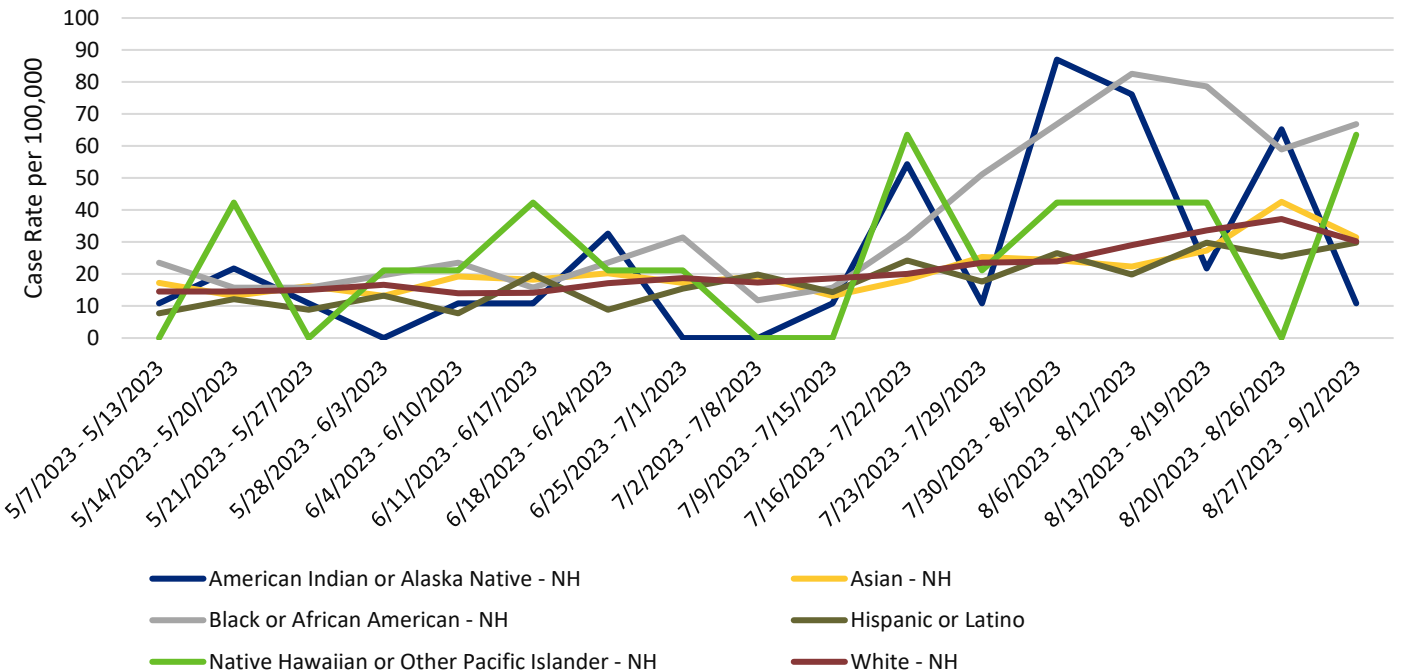
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## Snohomish County COVID-19 Case Rates per 100,000 by Illness Onset Date and Age Group



## Snohomish County COVID-19 Case Rates per 100,000 by Illness Onset Date and Race/Ethnicity

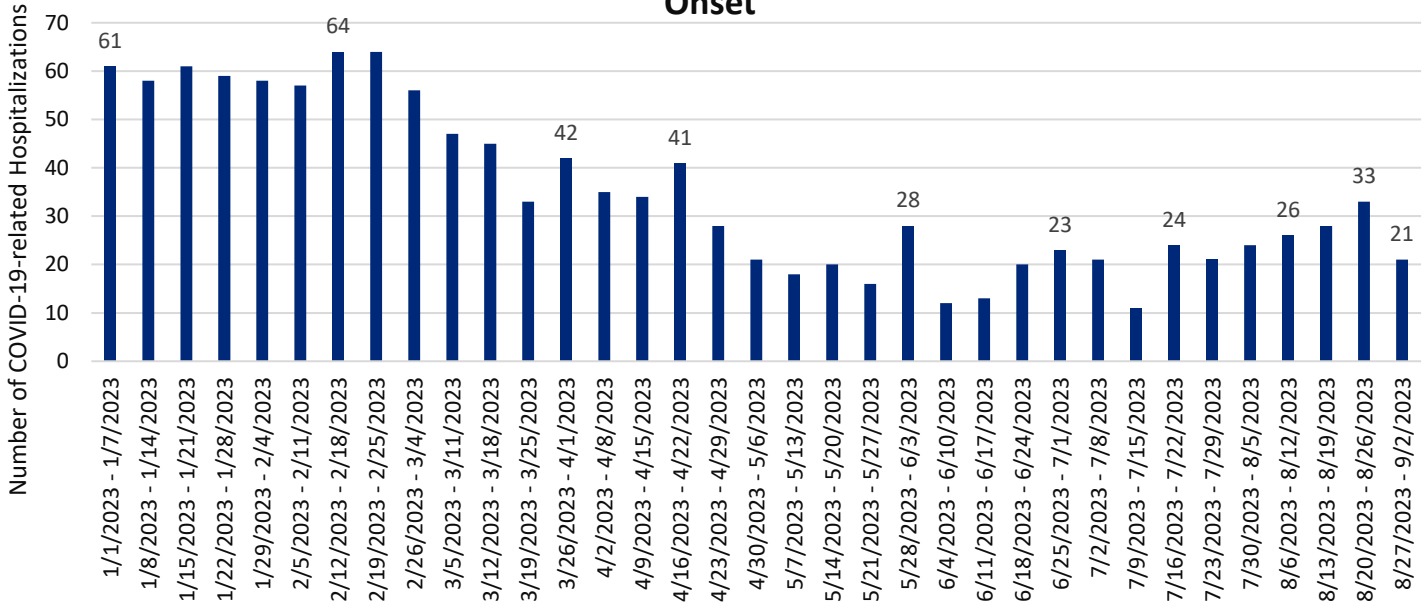


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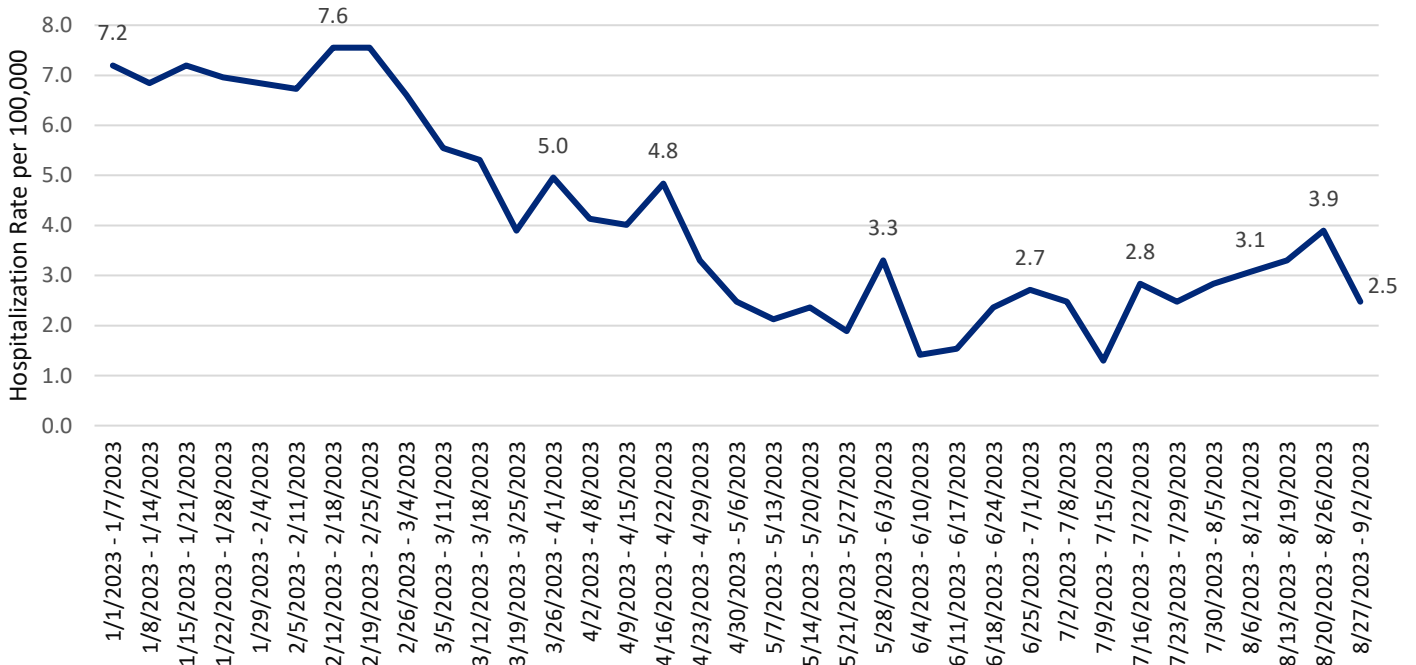

### Snohomish County COVID-related Hospitalizations by Week of Illness Onset



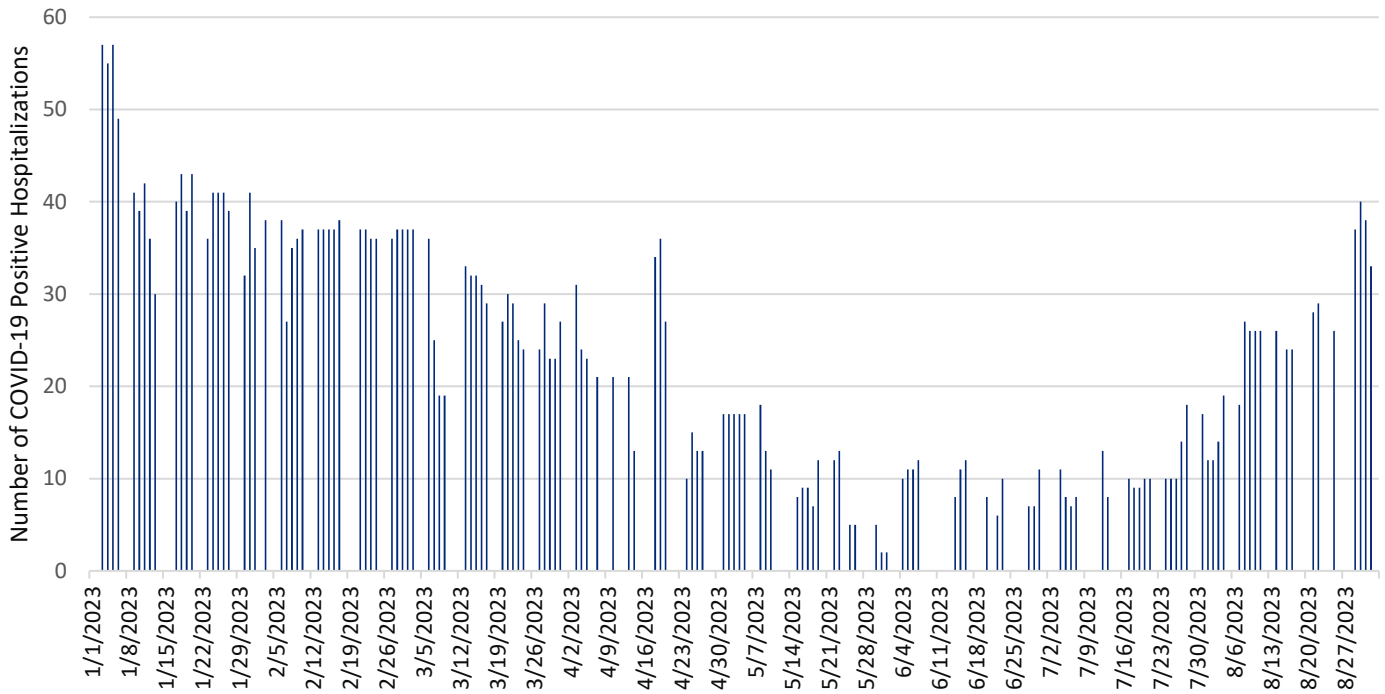
### Snohomish County COVID-19 Hospitalization Case Rate per 100,000 by Week of Illness Onset



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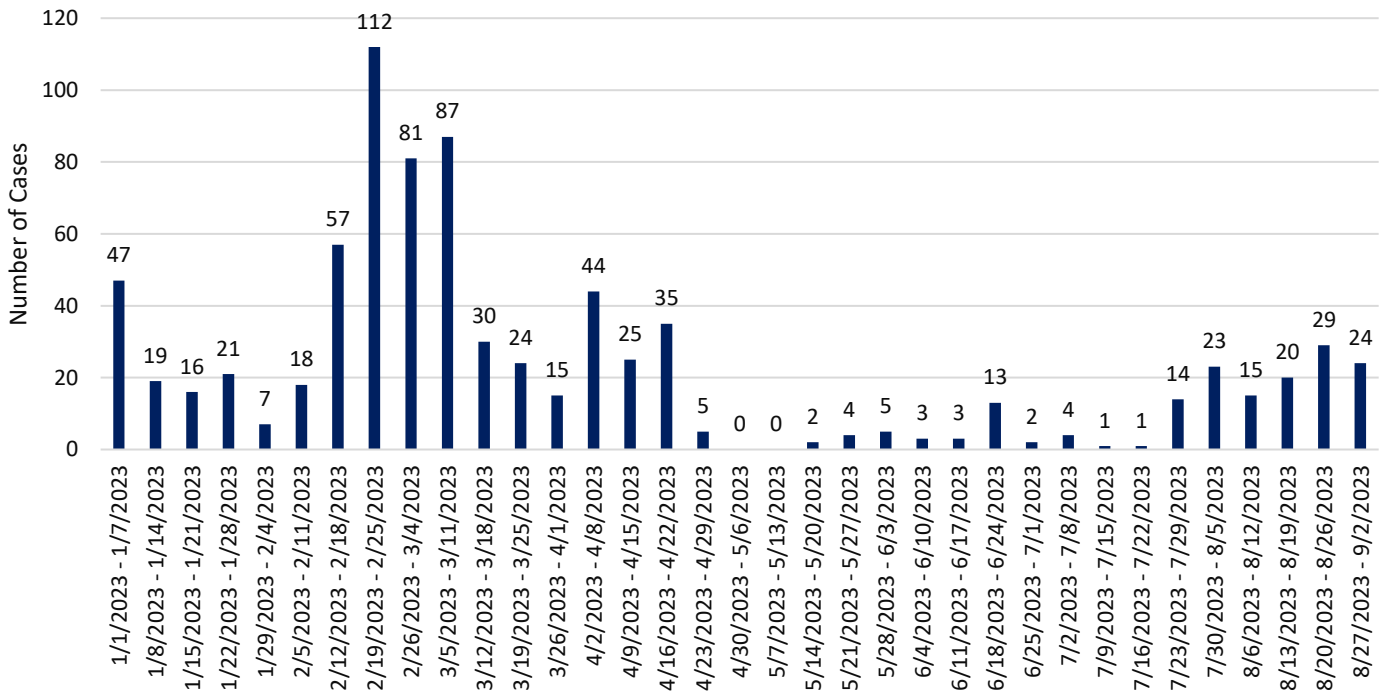
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## Snohomish County Point-in-Time COVID-19 Hospital Census

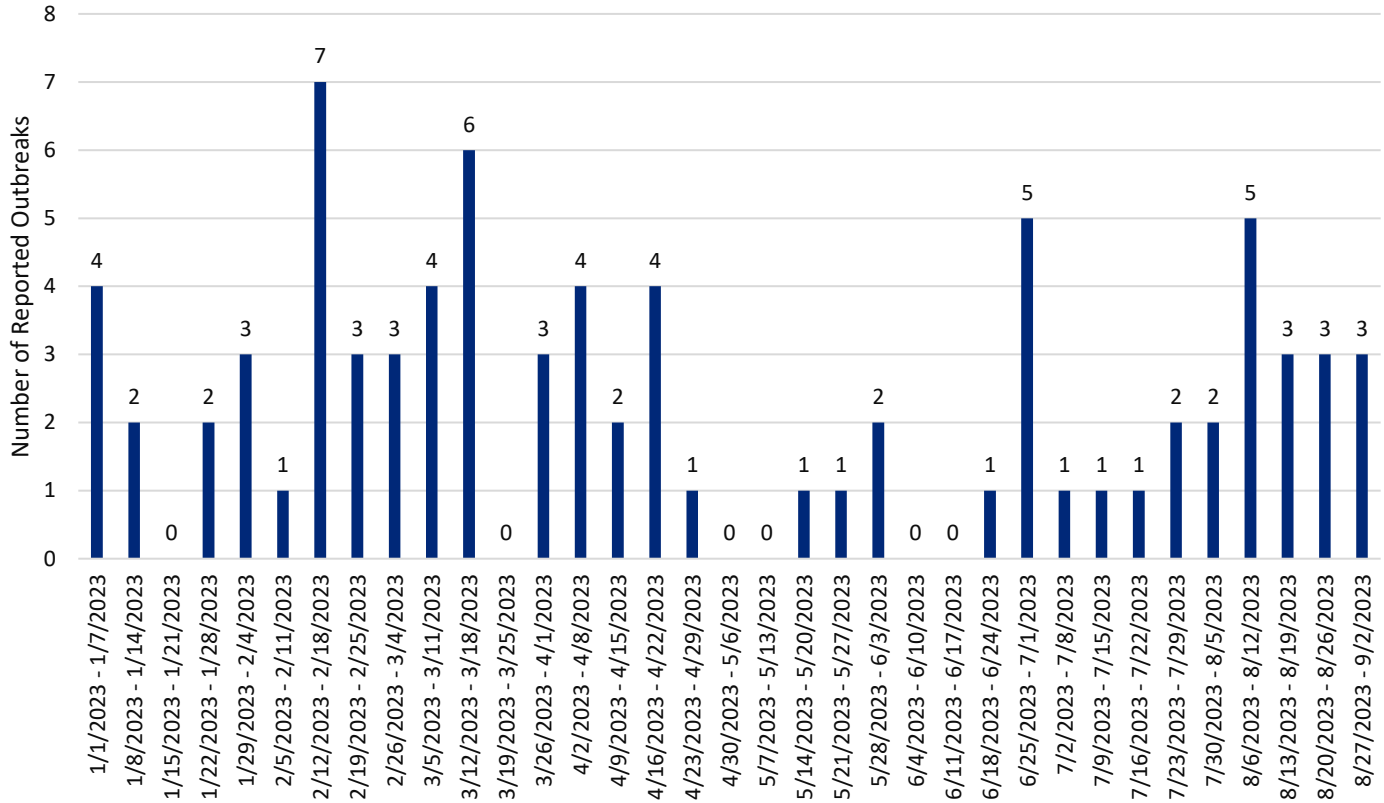
## Snohomish County Long-term Care Facility Outbreak Associated COVID-19 Cases by Onset Date
