

COVID-19 DRIVE-THRU TESTING REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS



Additional testing options are available for Snohomish County residents who meet prioritized criteria for COVID-19. This testing is by-appointment only.

Criteria for testing:

You will be eligible to register for a drive-thru testing appointment if you are:

- Experiencing symptoms (cough, fever of at least 100.4, sore throat, and/or shortness of breath)

AND

- Work in healthcare, public health or pharmacy - OR
- Work in public safety like law enforcement, fire or EMS - OR
- Work in a critical infrastructure like public utilities, transportation, correctional facilities, grocery stores, restaurants, shelters, gas stations, or child care - OR
- Are 60 years of age or older - OR
- Have underlying medical conditions or a weakened immune system - OR
- Are currently pregnant.

How to register:

- Go to <https://redcap.link/Snohomish-COVID-19> to register through the REDCap system.
- If the landing page states that testing is full, do not proceed. Check back later or monitor social media to see if additional dates and times have been released.
- If testing is still available, follow instructions for screening criteria.
- If the system determines you are eligible, you will be prompted to answer a series of questions about your symptoms, health history, profession, contact information, and more. Answer them honestly.
- Once finished, you will end on a screen that provides your testing identifier number along with your appointment confirmation. **Write down this testing identifier number and appointment time.** You should receive a confirmation email from the REDCap system that we recommend printing to bring with you.
- IMPORTANT: If you will have multiple people in the same vehicle who are eligible to be tested, you must repeat steps 1-5 for each person. Every person must have their own testing identifier number.

Preparing and arriving for testing:

- You must bring your testing identifier number, appointment time and photo ID with you.
- The testing site is at 3900 Broadway in Everett, and you will enter traveling southbound.
- Arrive 15 minutes before your appointment. Those who are more than 5 minutes late risk losing their appointment.
- You will remain in your vehicle the entire time. Please follow instructions provided by signs and staff at the site.

For medical emergencies, **call 911** & notify the dispatch personnel that you may have COVID-19.
